Adams also relinquished his position as president at the annual meeting of the A B C D Motor Credit Association.

The following resolution praising Mr. Adams for his services with the A B C D group was presented at the meeting:

"Whereas Birney J. Adams has been an active member of the group since 1913 and during all of the intervening years has, in a most helpful manner, assisted in its deliberations, and has added much to the harmonious working of this group; and

"Whereas it is the consensus of the members that Mr. Adams' distinguished service be given due recognition; therefore,

"Resolved that the rules pertaining to membership in the group in this instance be suspended and Birney Adams be, and he hereby is, accorded life membership in the group; and

"Resolved, further, that the secretary prepare for presentation to Mr. Adams on behalf of the membership an engrossed copy of these resolutions suitably bound as evidence of the high regard in which he is held by each member of the group."

The A B C D Motor Credit Association was the first organization of its kind in the United States, having been formed in 1910.
