Exchanged for **Seaman's** plantation in Lancaster County

Description

100 acres in Richmond County and North Farnham Parish, commonly called **Joseph Tayloe's** Quarter; bounded by **Mr. Robert Baylis**, **Edward Jones**, the Great Swamp; part of a tract of 350 acres formerly patented by **Luke Billington** 30 Oct 1669, left by will to son **Luke Billington**, and upon his death without heirs divided among daughters **Elizabeth**, **Jane** and **Barbara**
