This Indenture made the first day of November in the  
Third Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the Third  
by the Grace of God of Great Britain France & Ireland King &  
Defender of the Faith and in the Year of our Lord Christ One  
Thousand seven hundred and Sixty two Between *William*  
*Glasscock* and *Ann* his Wife of Dinwiddie county of the one  
part and *John Woodbridge* of Richmond county of the other  
part Witnesseth that the said *William Glasscock* and  
*Ann* his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two  
hundred and twenty two pounds Fifteen Shillings Current  
money to them or one of them in hand paid by the said *John*  
*Woodbridge* at or before the Enscaling and Delivery of these  
Presents the Receipt whereof they the said *William Glasscock*  
and *Ann* his Wife do hereby Acknowledge and thereof of  
every part and parcel thereof doth clearly acquit & discharge  
the said *John Woodbridge* his Executors and Administrators  
& every of them by these presents HAVE granted Bargained  
Sold Alien'd Enfeoffed and Confirmed & by these presents  
DO Grant Bargain Sell Alien Enfeoff and absolutely con-  
firm unto the said *John Woodbridge* & his Heirs All that  
Parcel of Land with the Appurtenances lately in the pos-  
session & Occupation of *Elizabeth Glasscock* now deceased

410 And which was in her life allotted to & accepted by her  
as her Power of and to the whole Tract of Land which  
Gregory Glascock her Husband and Father to the said  
William was in his life and at the time of his Death he  
seized & possessed of bounded as followeth that is to say  
Beginning at a large White Oak by the side of a Road commonly  
called the Lawe way Road and Joyning the Land some time  
before purchased by the said Woodbridge of the said Glascock  
Running thence North Seventy seven degrees West Thirty pole  
along the said Road and South Eighty one Degrees West  
Six pole to a Stake thence South Sixteen & a half degrees  
West Eighty pole along a line of marked Trees to another
